Pastor's Thoughts for November



I recently stumbled on a picture of a "thankful pumpkin." The idea is that every day during the month of November people write something to be thankful for on a pumpkin with a goal of covering it. As you immerse yourself in the process and start thinking about the things that you can be thankful for it will get easier and easier to fill up the pumpkin.

In Paul's first letter to the Thessalonians he writes "Rejoice always, pray without ceasing, give thanks

in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you." (5:16-18)

There is a common misunderstanding regarding these verses. Many think it says, "Give thanks *for* all circumstances." The verse actually says, "Give thanks *in* all circumstances."

Paul is not saying that we should give thanks for the messy and difficult circumstances that we find ourselves in and most especially not the Covid-19 virus! Instead, Paul would say that we are to look at our lives and our circumstances and give thanks to God for the good things that are happening *in spite* of the virus. God is actively at work in each of our lives bringing blessings to us and God's actions are not affected by the virus.

The month of November is the cloudiest and grayest month of the entire year. The month of November is also the month during which we set aside a day to give thanks. If you don't feel inclined to create a thankful pumpkin then I would encourage you to begin making a list. Write down one thing every day that you can be thankful for. Then say a prayer of thanks to God for every item on that list and allow it to grow until the blessings of all that God has done and continues to do for you fills your pumpkin.

Mark's Meditation

Maureen tells me that one of the upcoming scripture lessons will be the story in the book of Jonah. It's short, four chapters. I'm sure you know the story. God asks Jonah to go to Nineveh and prophesize its impending doom. Instead, Jonah goes the opposite direction. A storm ensues and he is swallowed by a fish which spits him out on shore. Chastened, Jonah goes to Nineveh, and delivers the prophesy "Yet forty days, and Nineveh will be destroyed." But the people repent, God took pity on the city and its fate is spared.

Jonah is the only person named in the story; and he is the only person that behaves badly. Everyone else does the right thing. If we look deeper at this book, we see that it is really a story about resurrection. When Jonah chooses to go to Tarshish (someplace in the western Mediterranean, possibly Carthage), he is choosing death. When the storm hits, he withdraws to the lowest part of the ship. When the sailors cast lots that implicate Jonah, he asks to be thrown overboard and sinks into hell.

"I sank beneath the waves, and the waters closed over me. Seaweed wrapped itself around my head. I sank down to the very roots of the mountains. I was imprisoned in the earth, whose gates lock shut forever." (Chapter 2. NLT)

Then God (the Lord, Yahweh) sends a fish to swallow Jonah "for three days and three nights." To the Hebrews hearing this story, that phrase would mean "a long journey." Jonah is not necessarily in the belly of the fish for three days; he is in the underworld for that time. It is the fish that brings him back. Clearly, the fish is a vehicle of salvation, not punishment.

The Gospel of Matthew (chapter 12) has Jesus recalling this story when he is asked to "show us a miraculous sign to prove your authority." Jesus replied, "Only an evil generation would demand a miraculous sign; but the only sign I will give them is the sign of the prophet Jonah. For as Jonah was in the belly of the great fish for three days and three nights, so will the Son of Man be in the heart of the earth for three days and three nights.

"The people of Nineveh will stand up against this generation on judgment day and condemn it, for they repented of their sins at the preaching of Jonah. Now someone greater than Jonah is here—but you refuse to repent."

Do you see the parallels with the Gospel? 1) Jonah is three days in Sheol, then resurrected. 2) The fact that God spares Nineveh, the capital of Israel's sworn enemy Assyria, demonstrates that Yahweh is lord of the whole world, not just the Hebrews. 3) Everyone repents except for Jonah, who sulks in a hut outside of Nineveh when its destruction doesn't happen. This parallels Jesus' teaching to look beyond ourselves for God's grace.

If you are interested in helping with the Community Dinner, the sign-up sheets are in the Lutheran Center during the week, and in church on Sunday mornings. Volunteers are needed for food prep and meal assembly for the Pick-Ups and deliveries. We are also in need of a few more delivery drivers.

As in the past, we will also be collecting food and monetary donations for the local food shelves in Cannon Falls and Red Wing.

During September and October alone, we have served almost 500 meals. Reservations are required and we have been nearly full each month. Please get your reservations in by NO LATER than NOVEMBER 4!! This is very helpful for our purchasing and planning.




