# Pastor's Thoughts for December

Isaiah 65:17-18 For I am about to create new heavens and a new earth; the former things shall not be remembered or come to mind. 18 But be glad and rejoice forever in what I am creating; for I am about to create Jerusalem as a joy, and its people as a delight.

The prophet Isaiah foretold that God was about to create new heavens and a new earth. This prophecy came as the exiles returned to Judah and Jerusalem and began the difficult work of rebuilding their lives. It had to be hard to remain optimistic as they looked around and saw so much devastation. Isaiah's words were intended to encourage the exiles even as they struggled in their day to day lives. These words proclaimed that God was soon going to be actively creating and that the people would see Jerusalem as a joy.

We, too, need an encouraging word as we wait. On the one hand, we have little choice but to continue with the daily tasks of life: the laundry, the meals, the cleaning of bathrooms, and the care of our children and pets. On the other hand, we should allow ourselves to dream: to anticipate with eagerness when our time of waiting will be complete. Because we are all waiting for something: waiting for Covid to be over, waiting for a holiday gathering, waiting to see family or hug a loved one.

Advent is a season of waiting as we await the coming of the Messiah. Like the exiles, we have struggled over the last twenty months. But God did not abandon the Israelites and God has not abandoned us. Even more encouraging is recognizing that we are witnesses to the fulfillment of the ancient prophecies. We know that our redeemer, our savior, our messiah lives. And his name is Jesus.



Please bring the unwrapped gifts, with the ornament from our tree attached, to the Lutheran Center or the church by **Sunday, December 19th at worship.** 





## Mark's Meditation

#### The Genealogy of Jesus

Matthew opens the story of the birth of Jesus with a genealogy. Why did he do this? It may be because there were rumors about the legitimacy of Jesus' birth. For instance, John tells a story of Jesus debating in the Temple. (John 8:31-41) Jesus tells the crowd "You are a slave to sin; and a slave is not part of the family." To which they respond "Our Father is Abraham!" Jesus then says "If you were really the children of Abraham, you would follow his example." To which they respond, implying that Jesus is illegitimate, "We aren't born of fornication! God himself is our Father."

So, Matthew gives a genealogy that goes all the way back to Abraham. (That is, the list goes back 1900 years.) But it is an interesting list in that he places four women into this genealogy. This is surprising because women in that era were thought to only be "incubators" for a male's seed. In this way of thinking, it only mattered who your father was. There are several things that stand out about these women. 1) They are all well-known in the Hebrew scriptures. 2) All of them are Gentiles. 3) By the standards of the day, all of them are sexually compromised.

The first of these women is Tamar, the daughter-in-law of Judah, one of the twelve sons of Jacob. Tamar's story is told in Genesis 38. Tamar is a Canaanite woman who marries Judah's son Er. When Er dies, according to Jewish law, Tamar marries Er's brother, who also dies. The remaining brother is just a child, so Judah sends Tamar away to live (in shame) with her family. In time, Judah's wife dies. When Tamar hears that Judah will be passing by, she disguises herself as a prostitute and avails herself to Judah. When she becomes pregnant, Judah makes her part of his harem, even though this is technically incest. She bears twin boys: Perez and Zerah. Matthew has Perez in the line to Jesus.

The second woman in Matthew's genealogy is Rahab who was known as "Rahab the prostitute." Her story is told in Joshua 2 & 6. She operates a brothel built into the wall around the Canaanite city of Jericho. She hides Joshua's spies and strikes a deal with them that her family should be spared when Joshua attacks. Rahab then marries Salmon and they have a son named Boaz.

The third woman is a Moabite named Ruth. Her story is told in the book of Ruth. A Jewish couple, Naomi and Elimelech move to Moab in search of work with their sons. While there, their sons marry Ruth and Orpah. In time, all the men die and Naomi moves back to Judah. Orpah returns to her family, but Ruth remains devoted to Naomi. Back in Judah they settle near the fields of Boaz and glean grain to make a meager meal. At the harvest festival, Ruth seduces Boaz by getting him drunk and sleeping with him. In time they marry and produce a son named Obed.

The fourth woman is referred to by Matthew as "the wife of Uriah the Hittite." We know her as Bathsheba, the woman that King David desired from the roof of his palace and got pregnant while her husband was fighting in his army. David arranged to get Uriah placed at the front of an attack, where he was killed. He then took Bathsheba into his harem. In time, Solomon was born.

What is Matthew trying to say here? John Shelby Spong argues that Matthew is trying to show that Jesus is from God—and God can do anything! God can bring holiness out of any human circumstance. God can bring holiness out of incest, prostitution, seduction, and adultery. Matthew is addressing head on the first century criticism that Jesus was base-born. Matthew says—we know better. We know God was in Christ and we know that God can work through any set of human circumstances to bring holiness out of life.


#### An Advent Meditation




Life will always provide matters for concern. Each day, however, brings with it reasons for joy.
