On Saturday, April 20 we went driving all over Goodhue County looking for spring wildflowers. We looked in Wally Gardiner's woods. We walked up to Gravbakken (the pioneer cemetery with the Civil War graves). We climbed the hill to the "white rock." We didn't find any wild flowers anywhere.

This is what my husband Mark wrote on his Easter Sunday Facebook post. "Today (Easter Sunday), right in our own backyard, we found dozens of Pasque flowers. Of course, "Pasque" is Latin for Easter." He continued, "What a perfect metaphor for the season. On Friday Maureen presided at a service with the altar covered in black--signifying our doubts about the message of Jesus. But if we have faith, if we wait just a little bit, we are rewarded."

I would add a quote from Frederick Buechner, "Whether your faith is that there is a God or that there is not a God, if you don't have any doubts, you are either kidding yourself or asleep. Doubts are the ants in the pants of faith. They keep it awake and moving."

If you have any "ants in your pants of faith," come talk to me. It's always good for me to listen to the questions with which people are struggling. Sometimes the Holy Spirit manages to use me to lead you

to the answers you are seeking.

#### Jesus was a Scoutmaster

For ten years I was an Assistant Scoutmaster and then the Scoutmaster for Troop 82 in Rochester. As Scoutmaster, my job was to help the youth leaders of the troop run the meetings and camps. If I was doing my job well, the Senior Patrol Leader would be prepared to lead the troop; and my only role during a meeting would be a talk at the end called the Scoutmaster Minute. Over time, I relished this opportunity to say something inspirational to the scouts. Earlier this month Maureen shared a sermon about the feeding of the five thousand and that reminded me of a Scoutmaster Minute I gave on November 29, 2008:

Tonight I want to talk about a story that is in all four Gospels: The feeding of five thousand people who came to listen to Jesus. This is from the 6th chapter of John and the 9th chapter of Luke.


(Luke) Jesus welcomed them and spoke to them about the kingdom of God, and healed those who needed healing.

<sup>12</sup>Late in the afternoon the twelve disciples came to Him and said, "Send the crowd away so they can go to the surrounding villages and countryside and find food and lodging, because we are in a remote place here."

<sup>13</sup>Jesus replied, "You give them something to eat."

They answered, ...(John) <sup>9</sup>"Here is a boy with five small barley loaves and two small fish, but how far will that go among so many?"

(Luke) But Jesus said to his disciples, "Have them sit down in groups of about fifty each." <sup>15</sup>The disciples did so, and everybody sat down. <sup>16</sup>Taking the five loaves and the two fish and looking up to heaven, he gave thanks and broke them. Then he gave them to the disciples to set before the people. <sup>17</sup>They all ate and were satisfied and the disciples picked up twelve basketfuls of broken pieces that were left over.




Now I'm a born engineer and am always wondering how things work. For a long time I wondered about this miraculous story. Then, several years ago, in this very room, a member of this church got up during a meeting, right over in that corner, and explained how it might have happened.

What might have happened is that when the disciples asked for food, only one young boy, probably about your age, came forward with five loaves of bread and two fish. And when Jesus blessed this selfless act a miracle happened. The miracle happened, not out in space, or out of thin air, but in the hearts of everyone in the crowd. And following the leadership of this young man, everyone in the crowd shared what food they had and everyone was feed.

This explanation of the story was life changing for me. It meant that stories like this are not stale, dead stories where miracles happen only when Jesus is physically there. But that God acts through people, and therefore, I can expect to experience miracles in my life. All I have to do is look for the goodness in people to find miracles.

I think that if the feeding of the five thousand had happened in the last 99 years, it would turn out that the boy with the 5 loaves and 2 fishes was a Boy Scout. Think about it, he was there, he saw a need and he acted. He was *helpful* as he *cheerfully* shared what he had. Then, through his *leadership*, everyone was taken care of.

#### The positive news:

Over 20 children sang, waved palms, and read parts on Palm Sunday. It was a joyous service.

#### The disappointing news:

Shelley Pohlman has resigned from the position of office administrator. The plan is for her to work through the end of May. We will begin the postings for the position after Holy Week and Easter.

The April 10-11 snowstorm caused havoc with the Lutheran Center roof. We have major water damage in the library. The storeroom off the gym has water on the cement floor which migrated toward the carpet and wicked into the carpet in two places. The kitchen ceiling has resumed dripping. Even before the storm and even though the roof appeared to be dry, water continues to leak through the ceiling of kitchen storeroom.

Sometimes the practical side of being a pastor and managing a parish is a challenge. In writing this I am referring to managing personnel and the failing roof on the Lutheran Center. But, I continue to say as I have said many times, "God isn't done with Vasa. We still have important work to do. We are still making a difference in people's lives.
