When I was a child I remember my mother carefully warming jars of baby food in a little kettle filled with water on the stove so as to feed my younger brother. The process took time. Microwave ovens changed all of that: food could be warmed within seconds.

We live in a society that encourages speed and quick results. Have a question? Look it up on the internet. You will have an answer in seconds.

Recently, my spiritual director showed me this quote from Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, a French Jesuit priest, paleontologist, and philosopher.

"Above all, trust in the slow work of God

This quote reminds us that God moves at God's pace and sometimes God's work is slow. Watching children grow and nurturing them, watching a tree grow to maturity, watching faith grow in someone that we never expected would make the faith connection, watching a person practice sobriety every day....these are all times when we recognize that God's work is slow.

We are on the edge of spring. A month ago, spring seemed to be in a hurry, but it has slowed down and we have no choice except to wait and watch. Even when seeds are finally planted, the farmer knows that it will take months for that seed to produce a crop. God's work just takes time.

Trust in the slow work of God my friends, trust in God's timing.

May 12: 1 Corinthians 7: 29-31 Living in a Messianic Time


May 19: Acts 2: 1-4; ! Corinthians 12: 1-13 The Gifts of the Spirit

Emily Carson, assistant to the bishop, propagated dozens of these cuttings and made them available for churches and delegates at the 2023 synod assembly. I took one home and settled it in the Vasa sanctuary for the summer of 2023. Flo did not thrive in the sanctuary so come September Flo was moved to the mailroom of the church offices. She did a little better, maybe she added a leaf or two.



The third picture was taken on April 10 and two things were noticeable. First, look at Wendy! Smiling! Second look at how much Flo has grown. Twelve leaves!

Sometimes it takes a long time for change to become noticeable: months, if not years. Pierre Teilhard de Chardin, a French Jesuit priest, wrote the following, "Above all, **trust in the slow work of God."** That's what we all are doing; trusting in God and in God's slow work.

The Vasa Rummage Sale was, once again, a huge success! Thanks to everyone who donated items to sell and baked goods, helped set up, worked at the sale, and helped to clean up! So many people—5 of whom weren't even members of our church— gave so much time to this fund-raiser which the committee greatly appreciated.

Total earnings from the sale were \$6,706.76. Bake sale proceeds were \$1,314—a new high for baked goods! Lunch sales were \$821.75. The rummage items brought in \$4,571.01.

The money will be used to purchase new flooring in the church.

Left-over items that weren't sold were donated to Bridging, Wise-Penny in Red Wing, The Salvation Army, Savers and several libraries.

We would like to invite you to participate in the upcoming Mayo Clinic Hospice Grief Support Groups. This summer we are offering the option of both Zoom or in-person Grief Support Groups in multiple locations. Our six-week specialized Grief Support Groups will begin the week of July 15th and go through the week of August 19th, 2024. The enclosed flier provides information regarding these groups and information about how to register.

We ask that you complete the entire form and include any additional information you think will be important for us to know. The group facilitators and bereavement coordinators will keep this information confidential.

When we receive your completed registration, you will then be sent a confirmation. Included will be a personal well-being checklist.

Participants who choose to attend their Grief Support Group on Zoom will need access to a computer with internet access, a microphone, and a camera. Participants also need to be able to meet in a private place without other people present because the conversations during grief group are to be kept confidential. You must provide an email to send materials for the meeting.

Because space can become limited, we encourage you to complete your registration prior to June 10th. Those who have attended these support groups rate them as very helpful.






